Guest Artists

DONNIE DEACON Born in Glasgow, Scotland, Donnie attended the Yehudi Menuhin School in London and the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia. He has performed as soloist with some the world's finest orchestras. Donnie is the Principal Second Violin of the National Arts Centre Orchestra.

MARGARET MUNRO TOBOLOWSKA A native of Toronto, Margaret began playing the cello at the age of twelve and was admitted to the University of Toronto when she was sixteen.
